

There will also be extra support to ensure your English and Maths skills are at the necessary level to ensure you achieve your goals. If you need to resit your GCSEs in these subjects you can do so at Priestley and our pass rates are excellent.

Priestley's Foundation Programme will help you in many ways including:

- Focussing on the skills you need to succeed such as note taking, presenting and working in teams
- Giving you the confidence to speak in groups, express your opinions and think critically
- Developing your ability to proofread and conduct research

Foundation Programme Pathways

Media and Film

An introduction to media products and audiences, potentially leading to the creation of your own radio shows and setting up webcasts. The perfect start towards preparing for a career in the film industry by developing technical skills, working in teams, understanding industry practices and being able to review film productions.

Working with Children in Early Years and Primary Settings

Secure the knowledge, understanding and skills you need to care for, and educate, children up to 12 years old. You can then progress onto Level 3 qualifications across a number of sectors including early years educator, supporting teaching and learning, as well as children and young people.

Computer Arts

Earn a BTEC Level 2 in Art & Design skills while through an HPQ build a digital world or complete a certification exam in Adobe Photoshop or Illustrator. Take on a live brief with a big company or magazine so that you can demonstrate your skills in a real-life scenario.

Foundation Programme Pathways

Health and Social Care

The perfect start to a career in this area as you work towards an OCR Diploma. Additional qualifications could include a Certificate in Mental Health Awareness and everything from manual handling to food hygiene. This pathway includes time in the workplace where you will develop vital skills, knowledge and experience.

Public Services

Cover topics such as the role and work of the Public Services as well as the responsibility of protecting communities. There will also be the opportunity to secure an Extended Certificate in Teamwork and Personal Development in the Community, as well as a Level 2 in First Aid.

Applied Science

Study key scientific principles that are vital for scientists and citizens of the future. Develop these principles in applied and vocational contexts, leading to an understanding of how they are applied in practice. An additional option could be an HPQ to develop your skills in referencing and formal, extended scientific prose.

Foundation Programme Pathways

IT

Explore the online world, technology systems and digital animation on your way to this Level 2 Certificate. Learn about computer hardware, digital audio and graphics. This flexible option could lead to studying our T-Level in years 2 and 3 as you build towards a career in the industry.

Business and Travel

By the end of your BTEC Level 2 you will have a grounding in a range of areas including Enterprise in the Business World, Finance for Business and the Principles of Marketing. Other specialist projects and/or additional modules will develop your industry-related expertise and enhance your academic and employability skills.

Sport

This Level 2 Certificate can lead to other sports courses and additional qualifications such as in First Aid, the Duke of Edinburgh Award, umpiring qualifications and the TQUK Level 1 Award in Volunteering. You will benefit from our partnerships with Warrington Wolves, Warrington Schools Partnership, Livewire and Active Soccer.

Art & Design

Explore and develop your ideas and produce final outcomes in a project at the end of the year. Experience projects in graphics, textiles, fine art and 3D design.



Your Programme Extras

Alongside your core Foundation Programme you will also be able to take one or more of the following to ensure you make the most of your time at Priestley:

English / Maths Pre-GCSE

If you obtain less than a Grade 3 or you need further support to develop your confidence and skills in English and Maths, we offer one-year Functional Skills Level 1 or Level 2 courses.

English / Maths up to GCSE

Any student who does not have a GCSE Grade 4 or above in English and / or Maths will have to work towards achieving that level whilst some students with a Grade 4 could choose to improve their mark to Grade 5 of above.


For those with a Grade 3 this will mean taking a one-year, re-sit programme whilst those with less than a Grade 3 will be able to take a pre-GCSE course.

The Higher Project Qualification (HPQ)

Many students who already have a GCSE Grade 4 or above in English and/or maths will take the HPQ. This course will develop your study and research skills based around a personal project of your own choice.

Work Experience Placement and Work-Related Learning

Students taking a Foundation Programme will be able to take part in a wide range of work-related learning activities including visits from employers, talks from visiting speakers, work experience and study trips. Some Foundation courses also offer a more structured and regular work placement option.



GCSE Science (subject to demand)

Suitable for those who have achieved a GCSE Grade 4 in core science or separate science. Topics include; nerves and hormones, evolution, metals and their uses, changes in the earth and its atmosphere, generating electricity. You will also carry out practical work in the form of a controlled assessment, which will count towards your final exam grade. There will be three exams at the end of the year – one in each of Chemistry, Physics and Biology. This course would allow you to progress onto our T-Level Science programme.
