

Priestley College and Warrington Wolves' Dual Development Academy sees students train like professional players whilst also securing the academic grades that can be crucial if their rugby careers do not take off.

In 2020, Priestley was awarded the UK's first Dual Academy accreditation in recognition of how it provides a platform for both boys and girls to enjoy and excel in the sport. You can read more about the girls' academy in this leaflet.

Members of the academy will benefit in the following ways:

Up to 12 hours training a week

Working with Warrington Wolves coaches

Strength and Conditioning support

Building knowledge about nutrition

Performance / video analysis

Competing in the Premiership College League

Opportunities to progress into Warrington Wolves' U19s or reserve grade teams

Second chance for players who have not been chosen for a scholarship

Chance to impress for those new to rugby or who have physically matured later

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Being a member of the academy gives you the chance to train for up to 12 hours a week, but also study an academic programme at Priestley College. These are just some of the course combinations our students have taken.

OUR girls' academy is part of the Warrington Wolves Women's team performance pathway. If you are interested in playing rugby at a higher level then this is the place for you to start.

The academy, however, is open to players of all abilities and experience so if rugby is simply a sport you want to enjoy while studying at Priestley College then you are also very welcome.

This is a progression from the Warrington Wolves under 16s girls and is a chance to compete nationally in competitions run by the Rugby Football League.

We also support students on the RFL national DiSE programme – an elite national development squad of 30 girls. Qualifying for this is worth 80 UCAS points and you can only be considered if attending a development academy.
