Raising aspirations with Oxford and Cambridge

Priestley is a hub for **OxNet** – a programme run by the University of Oxford and Pembroke College aimed at making higher education more accessible.

OxNet is unapologetically academic in its focus, and has had significant impact in the local communities in which it has worked since 2008.

This happens through a rigorous academic programme featuring seminars (run at Priestley), and Easter and Summer conferences.

Oxford also has a relationship with **TCAT** which involves our Year 12 students accessing specialist **STEM** and languages support sessions, academic talks, experimental facilities and the latest research.

Priestley also takes part in **HE+**, a collaborative project with the University of Cambridge. **HE+** is a year-long programme that includes academic extension classes, subject masterclasses, information and guidance sessions, and a visit to the university.



Throughout the year we invite speakers into college to help you make the right decisions about your future.

Representatives from UCLan, Dundee, Arts University of London, Liverpool Hope and Chester universities are just some of those who attend.

They offer advice on how to apply to university, writing personal statements, degree apprenticeships and early applicant interviews for Oxbridge.

Priestley also organises a number of study days at University College Oxford for those students aiming to study at Russell Group universities.

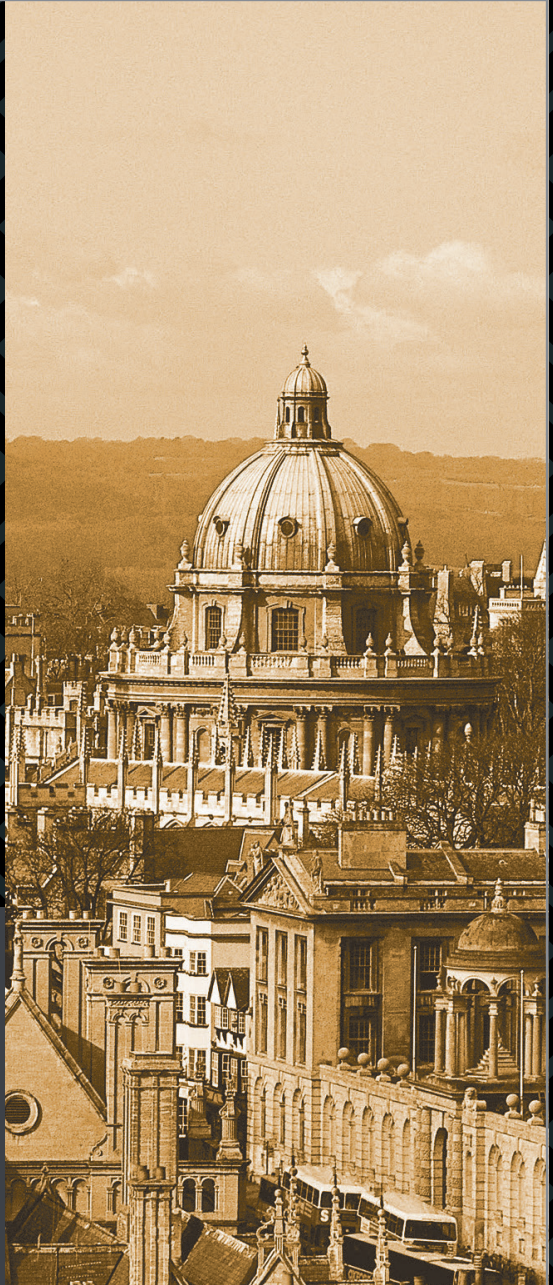
Each year we dedicate Choices Week to helping students gather all the information they need for university. More than 100 sessions take place.

Pre Law

Our Pre Law programme is designed to prepare A-Level students who want to progress onto a law-related degree or career.

There will be the opportunity for you to take part in mock trial competitions against other colleges as well as trips to crown and magistrates courts.

Our students enter mooting competitions - simulated court hearings that challenge those taking part to analyse a problem, research a law and prepare oral arguments.

We have a link with a local solicitor who offers work experience.

Key events include helping students with personal statements and preparation for The Law National Aptitude Test, which will help you determine if you have chosen the right career.

Priestley's Pre Med course supports students applying for Medicine, Dentistry and degrees linked to the healthcare profession.

Students are prepared for medical school applications, interviews and UCAT/BMAT.

A student's view

Madgey Thompson headed for the University of Oxford after leaving Priestley College with A*s in French, English Literature and Psychology.

She decided to pursue her love of languages at university by studying French & Arabic.

"When I realised there were lots of links between French and Arabic it seemed like the perfect course for me because I love the idea of learning history through a new language," she said.

It was only through studying at Priestley, taking advantage of the opportunities on offer, that Madgey realised universities such as Oxford were 'open to her'.

Initially she thought of them as being too elite, but her time at college changed her perceptions and aspirations.

We caught up with Madgey six months after she joined Oxford to ask about her experience up to that point.

The former King's Academy pupil said the UK's most competitive universities needed state school students.

"We do think a little differently and bring something unique to the university," she said.

"I did have a feeling of 'imposter syndrome' when I first was offered a place at Oxford, but that has gone away now."



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
