## When & Where can I get my results?

### A Level, AS Level, Level 3 Vocational – Thursday 15th August

#### Year 2 students (i.e. students completing courses and leaving college)

- You will be able to collect your results between 8:00-10:00am on Thursday 15th August from the Sports Hall.
- Staff will be available in the LRC to provide advice and guidance regarding next steps, UCAS choices and clearing options.

#### Year 1 students (i.e. students completing AS levels or Year 1 of a vocational course and returning for Year 2)

- You will be able to collect your results between 10:30am-12:30pm on Thursday 15th August from the Sports Hall.
- There will be some staff available in the LRC to provide advice and guidance if needed, but students who are returning who still need to confirm courses will be contacted from 22nd August by our Progress Tutor team.

Results for all students will be available online on the REMS Portal platform from 8:30am. They can be accessed via the 'My Details' tab, then click the 'Enrolments' tab. Grades will be presented against each course in the 'Grade' column.

### GCSE & Level 2 – Thursday 22nd August

- You will be able to collect your results between 8:30-10:00am from the Priestley Reception on Thursday 22nd August.
- Results will be available online on REMS Portal from 9:00am as detailed above but you will now need to click 'All Years' at the bottom of the page
- Our College Careers Advisors (Amy & Ian) will be available in the LRC to provide advice and guidance should this be needed.
- If you are returning to Priestley in September you may also require an appointment on Thursday 29th August to discuss your programme following the release of your results.



## Can someone else pick up my results for me?

- You can nominate a friend/family member to collect your results slip on your behalf. They will need to bring a written note from yourself stating your name, student ID number, DOB, that you authorise [their name] to collect on your behalf, then sign and date the note. Whoever is collecting will need to bring their photo ID.
- Your nominee won't be able to collect your slip unless they have this. We can't accept authorisation via text or phone call.

## I can't come in on results day to collect my results slip, what do I do?

- Results slips will still be available for several weeks from Central Services, opposite Crescent Reception. Remember to bring your student ID card or follow the process above if someone else is collecting on your behalf.

## Can a results slip be emailed to me?

- You should try to access your results online or get someone else to collect your results slip on your behalf in the first instance.
- We can email results slips to your college email address but this will be during the afternoon of results day, we can't guarantee a time.
- To request you must send an email from your College email address to [exams@priestley.ac.uk](mailto:exams@priestley.ac.uk) with your name, student ID number, DOB and that you would like a copy of your results slip to be emailed. Be patient, the Exams team will reply as soon as possible.

## I have a query, how do I contact the Exams Department?

- The best way to contact is to email [exams@priestley.ac.uk](mailto:exams@priestley.ac.uk) stating your full name, DOB, student ID number and your query. The Exams team will be busy dealing with lots of queries, be patient as they will reply as soon as possible.

## How do I apply for Post Results Services?

- Where possible you should speak with your subject tutor in the first instance.
- You will need to complete a Post Results Services (PRS) form, please email [exams@priestley.ac.uk](mailto:exams@priestley.ac.uk) stating your full name, student ID number and you would like a PRS form. The Exams team will reply as soon as possible.
- Fees and deadlines apply.

## What if I don't get an offer from my first choice of University?

If you find yourself in this situation take some time to look again at the offer(s) you are holding then contact one of our college Careers Advisers (Amy & Ian) who will be in the LRC on Results Day and the following week for individual advice.

- Be prepared to talk to university representatives about why you now want to continue your studies and why you are interested in their course.
- In addition to any verbal offer a university may make you, you will also need to complete a UCAS form. If you started an application earlier in the year, make sure you have the right passwords to access it.

## I am returning to Priestley next year, how do I confirm my courses?

- You should have already had a meeting where you indicated your courses with your Progress Tutor but we know that some people will be waiting on the outcome of results.
